EFFECTIVE DATES 8/28/2024 to 2/28/2025

AREAS

The Marine Areas of Northern Puget Sound from the Canadian Border south to the environs of Seattle, including Washington State Marine Fish and Shellfish Catch Reporting and Management Areas 20A, 20B, 21A, 21B, 22A, 22B, 23A, 23B, 25A, 25B, 25D and 26AW, except those portions of 23A, 23B and 25A south and west of a line from Trial Island light (off Victoria, BC) to vessel traffic lane buoy "R" (between Hein Bank and Dungeness Spit) to the Point Wilson light. This regulation opens a portion of the Lummi Nation usual and accustomed fishing grounds and stations (U&A). It is not, and should not be taken as, a statement of the limits of Lummi's U&A

SPECIES

Sea Cucumber (*Parastichopus californicus*)

LEGAL GEAR

Restricted to individual hand-harvest by divers

**COMMERCIAL
SEASON AND
OPEN DAYS**

In recent years, the tribal harvesting parties have worked cooperatively to set harvest schedules that extend opportunity and provide a margin of safety for harvest divers while maintaining a consistent demand for their product in the marketplace. The opening and closing dates identified below are subject to change pending similar cooperation among the tribal harvesting parties.

Harvest open the following days restricted to daylight hours only in all areas.

RESTRICTIONS

The February 2019 version of the Lummi Nation Commercial Harvest Diving Standards (hereafter, the standards) must be observed pursuant to Regulation 2019-09. Parties participating in dive harvest operations must be classified by the Lummi Natural Resources Department (LNR) pursuant to the standards and Regulation 2019-09. The minimum crew size is three; however, more fishers are allowed as per the Natural Resources Code (Title 10). At least three of the fishers participating in commercial harvest diving operations must be classified by LNR pursuant to the LNR Commercial Harvest Diving Standards. These three fishers should have in their possession their current diving/hose tending classification cards issued by LNR. Eligibility to participate in a Lummi commercial harvest diving operation can also be confirmed through the LNR fishing database and/or by contacting the LNR Diving Safety Administrator at 360-312-2261. All commercial harvest divers must have in their possession valid sea cucumber harvest validation stickers issued by LNR. Harvest is restricted to daylight hours only, i.e., diving activities must take place between official sunrise and sunset, unless otherwise posted in this regulation. Sea cucumbers must be harvested by methods that do not penetrate the bodies of the animals. Shipboard logs (e.g., harvest log and/or dive log) must be available for inspection by authorized LNR staff, LNR Enforcement, and other parties authorized by the LNR Director. All sea cucumbers harvested must be sold to a Lummi Indian Business Council (LIBC)-licensed and bonded buyer who must submit shellfish receiving tickets to LNR in a timely manner, adhering to its written agreement with LIBC. Harvests of sea cucumbers shall be monitored through shellfish receiving tickets to ensure that landings by tribal harvesters do not exceed the agreed allocations. By prior co-manager agreement, the fishery will be closed from March 1, 2023 through June 30, 2023 to protect the peak spawning period of sea cucumbers. The following areas are closed to the commercial harvest of sea cucumbers: a) Argyle Lagoon: Those University of Washington-owned tidelands and bedlands enclosed by the inner spit of Argyle Lagoon on San Juan Island. b) Those waters of San Juan Channel and Upright Channel within the following lines: South of a line projected from Flat Point on Lopez Island due west to Shaw Island; west of a line from Neck Point on Shaw Island to Steep Point on Orcas Island; south of a line from Steep Point on Orcas Island to Limestone Point on San Juan Island; north of a line from Flat Point on Lopez Island to the northernmost point of Turn Island and thence projected due west to San Juan Island. c) Those waters of Haro Strait north of a line projected due west from the southernmost point of Cattle Point on San Juan Island to the international border, and south of a line projected due west from a point one-quarter mile north of Lime Kiln Light on San Juan Island to the international border. If anyone develops COVID-19 symptoms, the crew member is to call the Public Health phone line immediately (360-383-8251) to report symptoms and to undergo screening for further testing.

JUSTIFICATION

This regulation is to proceed with harvest according to comanager agreement in the 2024-25 Puget Sound Sea Cucumber Harvest Management Plan and is promulgated pursuant to Chapter 10.6 of the Lummi Law and Order Code
